The Internet practice test counts for 40 pts of the exam

0-25%=25 points

26-39%=30 points

40-50%=35 points

41-55=40 points

55% or higher=+10 points

Will earn +5 points if above 55% and shows 5% increase from mid term exam

There will be an essay graded AP style (1-5 as before, not using 9 scale, but for overall AP scoring). You will be expected to quickly scan some materials like the synthesis essays shown in class, but you will be allowed to use your own literature to prepare for this. Marking quotes or key passages in advance is allowed. Book sharing will not be permitted for this exam.

The only way to prepare for this section is to have read and understood the literature, be able to write clearly, concisely, and coherently on the topic, to use specific references that back up the points you are making, and by thoroughly understanding the material. You may NOT use Internet materials for this exam.

Score of 1=10 points (off topic and poorly written, did not attempt to make much sense)

Score of 2=20 points (made effort and showed some understanding, grammar or clarity problem)

Score of 3=35 points (good effort, good support, slight problems, solid points)

Score of 4=45 points (excellent effort, sound support, almost no errors, some logic problems)

Score of 5=55 points (solid logic, upper level structure and vocabulary, virtually flawless)

Length should be a minimum of 5 well-developed paragraphs, but most students do write more than that. You will probably write less on the actual AP test, as you will probably not have read the materials previously.
