

Spanish II study guide for TRI A exam

There are 3 parts to the exam

Part I --Oral Portion	20 points
Part II—Proficiency Sheet	50 points
Part III—Multiple choice written	50 points

Part I—Oral portion

- Will begin the week before the exam and finish the last day before exam.
- All make ups must be before or after school if you miss your scheduled day and must be done before end of marking period.
- You will have to start by spinning the question wheel and ask me a question or questions.
- I must be able to follow your topic and vocabulary.
- If I do not know (or pretend not to know) a vocabulary word you use, you must explain it in Spanish.
- Goal of this section is to communicate.
- Speed isn't an issue, but should work toward 3 minutes min. Must all be in the present tense
- I will also be judging your speaking during the last skit
- You won't speak in front of the class for the questioning portion
- You may not use any notes, and you should be able to use some newer vocabulary (of your choice).

Part II—Proficiency

- A completed proficiency sheet at 80% will count as 50 points of the exam.
- This is due Monday prior to exam for full credit
- This will also count as 100 points toward marking period grade.
- 100% proficiency will be for extra credit and can be used for exam or for 2nd marking period. This decision is due BEFORE exam.

Part II—Multiple choice

- Will focus on commands (formal, informal, plural, singular, all irregulars),
- reflexive verbs
- translation into Spanish or from Spanish into English
- Some subjunctive
- units 1-3, and learnables.
- Stem changing verbs
- You may use your notes/books for only a limited time during this portion.
